

## **Public Participation in Board Meetings**

All Board meetings, with the exception of closed sessions, will be open to the public. The Board invites district citizens to attend Board meetings to become acquainted with the program and operation of the district. Members of the public also are encouraged to share their ideas and opinions with the Board when appropriate.

It is the intent of the Board to ensure communications with individuals with disabilities are as effective as communications with others. Individuals with hearing, vision or speech impairments will be given an equal opportunity to participate in Board meetings.

Auxiliary aids and services for persons with disabilities will be available at no charge to the individual.

All auxiliary aids and/or service requests must be made with appropriate advance notice. Should the Board demonstrate such requests would result in a fundamental alteration in the service, program or activity or in undue financial and administrative burdens, alternative, equally effective means of communication will be used.

### **Audience**

During an open session of a Board meeting, members of the public are specifically invited to present concerns during the designated portion of the agenda. At the discretion of the President, further public participation may be allowed.

### **Request for an Item on the Agenda**

A member of the public may request the superintendent place an item of concern on the agenda of a regular Board meeting. This request should be made in writing and presented to the superintendent for consideration at least ten working days prior to the scheduled meeting.

### **Procedures for Public Participation in Meetings**

The Board will establish procedures for public participation in open meetings. The purpose of these procedures will be to inform the public how to effectively participate in Board meetings for the best interests of the individual, the district and the patrons. The information will be easily accessible and available to all patrons attending a public Board meeting.

Discussion or presentation concerning a published agenda item is limited to its designated place on the agenda, unless otherwise authorized by the President.

A visitor speaking during the meeting may introduce a topic not on the published agenda during public comment. The Board, at its discretion, may require that a proposal, inquiry or request be submitted in writing, and reserves the right to refer the matter to the administration for action or study.

Any person who is invited by the President to speak to the Board during a meeting should state his/her name and, if speaking for an organization, the name and identity of the organization. A spokesman should be designated to represent a group with a common purpose.

Statements by members of the public should be brief and concise. The President may use discretion to establish a time limit on discussion or oral presentation by visitors.

Questions asked by the public, when possible, will be answered immediately by the President or referred to staff members for reply. Questions requiring investigation may, at the discretion of the President, be referred to the superintendent for response at a later time.

At the discretion of the Board President, anyone wishing to speak before the Board, either as an individual or as a member of a group, on any agenda item or other topic, may do so by providing the Board secretary with a completed registration card prior to the Board meeting in order to allow the President to provide adequate time for each agenda item.

The Board President should be alert to see that all visitors have been acknowledged and thanked for their presence and especially for any contributed comments on agenda issues. Similar courtesy should be extended to members of staff who have been in attendance. Their return for future meetings should be welcomed.

### **Petitions**

Petitions may be accepted at any Board meeting during public comment. No action will be taken in response to a petition before the next regular meeting. Petitions will be referred to the superintendent for consideration and recommendation.

### **Criticisms of Staff Members**

Speakers may offer objective criticism of district operations and programs, but the Board will not hear complaints concerning individual district personnel. The President will direct the visitor to the appropriate means for Board consideration and disposition of legitimate complaints involving individuals.

## **Public Participation in Board Meetings**

1. When recognized by the President, a visitor should rise, identify himself/herself with his/her full name and state his/her purpose for appearing.
2. A group of visitors with a common purpose should designate a spokesman for the group.
3. Discussion or presentation concerning a published agenda item is limited to its designated place on the agenda, unless otherwise authorized by the President.
4. A visitor may introduce a topic not on the published agenda. The Board, at its discretion, may require that a proposal, inquiry, or request be submitted in writing and reserves the right to refer the matter to the administration for action or for study and to report at a subsequent meeting. The Board shall make a decision at the meeting where information is presented only if the issue is considered an emergency by the Board.
5. At the discretion of the Board President, when meetings are large or controversial, anyone wishing to speak before the Board, either as an individual or as a member of a group, on any agenda item or other topic, may do so by providing information to the Board secretary on a sign-in sheet prior to the meeting. This will help the President provide adequate time for each agenda item.
6. Statements by members of the public should be brief and concise. The President may, at his/her discretion, establish a time limit on discussion or oral presentation by a visitor on any topic.
7. Speakers may offer objective criticism of district operations and programs but the Board will not hear complaints concerning specific district personnel. The President will direct the visitor to the appropriate means for Board consideration and disposition of legitimate complaints involving individuals.
