

Admission of Resident Students

The following regulations apply to all students who are enrolling in a school, under the direction of the Lincoln County School Board, for the first time.

- 1* The student must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
- 2* The student must be five (5) years old on or before September 30 of that year to enter kindergarten; and six (6) years old on or before September 30 of that year to enter 1st grade.
- 3* The parent or guardian must present a health record that certifies that NRS 392.435 is being met (NRS 392.435 is law requiring immunization of pupils.)
- 4* A birth certificate or other document suitable as proof of the child's identity and if applicable, a copy of the child's records from the school he/she most recently attended must be presented when the student is enrolled. If proper documentation is not presented, action must be taken as stipulated in NRS 392.
- 5* All students must be enrolled under his/her legal name.

Those students whose transfer records indicate a record of suspensions, expulsions, and other strong disciplinary actions, will be treated as if those actions had taken place within Lincoln County School District. All disciplinary actions recorded during the current school year will be taken into consideration in our school discipline plans and actions.

All students transferring from schools other than those in Lincoln County may be accepted and assigned to classes according to available records. Students with a record of suspensions, expulsions, or other strong disciplinary actions may not be enrolled until after permanent records are available for review or direct communication with the previous school occurs. A verified copy of the permanent record of the student shall be requested and made a part of the Lincoln County School District record file.
