

Alternative Education Programs Following Expulsion

Prior to a student leaving school or a student's expulsion, the district will propose to the student or student's parent appropriate, accessible educational alternatives as determined by the district. Such alternative education program(s) will consist of instruction or instruction combined with counseling.

Appropriate accessible alternative education programs may be either public or private (nonsectarian). Programs may be provided by the district as a separate school, evening classes or tutorial instruction. Homebound instruction or Lincoln County Academy could be considered an appropriate alternative.

If a student is not successful in the alternative education program selected or the alternative education programs offered are not accepted by the student and/or parent, there is no obligation to propose or fund other alternatives.
