## **Adult Education Programs**

Adult programs are designed to give individuals who are 17 years or older (16 years of age with parental and school board permission) the chance to complete their education by earning either a High School Equivalency Certificate, an Adult High School Diploma, or to improve their basic education skills. High School Proficiency, End of Course and High School Equivalency testing opportunities are provided to adult students on a regular basis. All required subjects, courses, and testing are offered.

Courses offered for credit are delivered in different ways and include: Independent Study, Distance Education, in class courses, credit by exam, and packets. The adult programs run concurrently with the school year unless a student is enrolled in Independent Study or Distance Education, or if they are incarcerated. Programs are offered to community members, to inmates at the Pioche Conservation Camp, and to prisoners at the Sheriff's Department Detention Center. Inmates receive instruction in the early mornings, Mondays, Fridays and as needed on Saturdays. Community courses are offered to the public in the afternoons and evenings and by prior arrangement.

Students may register by contacting the district office, any of the high schools in the district, or the Adult High School directly. Student transcripts and records are reviewed for completeness and a unique plan is created for each individual student. Timelines are flexible; however, students are encouraged to advance through the program as quickly as possible.

College courses are available through the College of Southern Nevada and Great Basin College with satellite sites in Alamo, Caliente, and Panaca.
